Narratives

Disaster Damage:

The City of Springfield was dramatically impacted by multiple Presidentially-Declared Disasters in 2011, the most severe of which was a June 1, 2011 F3 tornado. The tornado ripped through the downtown areas of Springfield and cut a mile swath through several neighborhoods, finally exiting the City limits through the East Forest Park and Sixteen Acres Neighborhoods. Current estimates of damage from this disaster exceed \$170 million.

In addition to the tornado, in 2011 the City endured two disastrous snow storms, the worst of which was a surprise October Nor'Easter that caused approximately \$30 million in damages and recovery costs. In addition, the City also received another Presidential Disaster Declaration for damages caused by Hurricane Irene.

While the tornado's path encompassed portions of eight neighborhoods, the vast majority of residential damage took place in just five: South End, Six Corners, Old Hill, East Forest Park, and Sixteen Acres. Following the tornado, the City grouped the tornado-impacted neighborhoods into three districts, each of which has different characteristics and needs. District 1 is Metro Center and the South End, District 2 is Six Corners, Old Hill, Upper Hill, and Forest Park, and the third District is East Forest Park and Sixteen Acres.

District 1: Metro Center and South End

The Metro Center and South End neighborhoods include a combination of commercial and residential uses, and over 90% of housing units are renter-occupied. In the South End and Metro Center, 30 structures with 242 housing units were condemned following the tornado. Ninety-nine housing units were destroyed. The building housing the South End Community Center and the Zanetti School building were badly damaged. A major mixed-use property at 979 Main Street was destroyed and a number of retail buildings along Main Street also suffered extensive damage. Severely damaged commercial property included the administrative offices and a child care site for Square One, an early childhood learning center.

District 2: Six Corners, Old Hill, Upper Hill and Forest Park

The majority of tornado damage in District 2 took place in the Six Corners and Old Hill neighborhoods. The primary location of damage in the Upper Hill neighborhood was located on the campus of Springfield College, where a dormitory was severely damaged and mature trees were toppled. A small number of homes and businesses on the edge of Forest Park were also damaged.

District 3: East Forest Park and Sixteen Acres

In the East Forest Park and Sixteen Acres neighborhoods, 146 single-family homes were condemned following the tornado. Fifty-six were destroyed. East Forest Park also experienced extensive damage to the Mary Dryden Elementary School and Cathedral High School, a local parochial school. The neighborhood, which includes areas of natural resources, lost extensive amounts of trees and sustained damages to parks and open space.

Recovery Needs:

At two years post-tornado, the City has witnessed the uneven recovery that has taken place: middle-class homeowner neighborhoods have been substantially rebuilt with homeowners insurance payments, while neighborhoods that were in distress prior to the tornado have experienced further abandonment and delay in recovery. The City intends to use CDBG-DR funds not only to address lingering individual disaster recovery needs, but also to revitalize the distressed neighborhoods that are slow to recover.

The City estimates the total amount of housing damage is \$70,755,000. The total amount of insurance claims plus SBA loans paid out is estimated to be \$27,146,708. The remaining total unmet housing need is \$43,608,292

Springfield businesses sustained an estimated \$40,781,633 in total commercial loss and interrupted business operations. In



total, \$20,614,503 of recovery funds has been disbursed, including SBA loans of \$2,755,500 and commercial insurance of \$17,859,003. This leaves \$20,167,130 in current unmet need.

The amount of Infrastructure unmet need is \$59,055,679.

Springfield's recovery effort must focus not only on economic recovery, but also neighborhood and economic revitalization, which is not captured in the above analysis. CDBG-DR funds must begin to address these unmet needs as well. Although Springfield has an estimated \$122,831,101 in unmet building, infrastructure and community facility needs, there is an urgent need to revitalize extremely poor neighborhoods hit by the June 2011 tornado, and to stimulate economic activity.

Springfield is focusing neighborhood recovery on the South End, Six Corners and Old Hill, neighborhoods which are made up predominantly of persons of color (each neighborhood is less than 25% white), and which have median household incomes of under \$25,000. The City will affirmatively further fair housing by targeting workforce training opportunities to residents of these neighborhoods and by improving conditions in these neighborhoods. Improvements include development of new housing for homeownership, roadway and sidewalk replacement, demolition of distressed housing, home repair, and purchase of buildings to meet neighborhood educational needs. The expectation is that the focused nature of these improvements will improve property values and spur further privately-funded improvements.

Overall Progress Narrative:

Activity #1: Acquisition and Development for Homeownership. The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. Interior construction on the houses continues to progess steadily. A buyer has been identified and approved for the home on Florence Street and the City



anticipates the closing and final invoice for Florence Street next quarter.

Activity #1(E): Acquisition and Development for Homeownership. This activity is an extension of activity Acquisition and Development for Homeownership, which was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver, for financial purposes only.

Activity #2: Removal of Blight. The City completed the demolition of 22 Richelieu Street and 575 Union Street this quarter. The City began all pre-demolition prep work for the demolition for 523 Union Street and the City anticipates that demolition being completed with non-federal funds next quarter.

Activity #3: Housing Repair. The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. The City has one active loan and construction work was completed on this loan, the City anticipates the invoice being received from the contractor next quarter. The City has conducted one lead inspection and anticipates that loan going to contract next quarter. The City has received ten additional applicants for this acitivity and is working with homeowners on getting all documents needed for processing.

Activity #3(E): Housing Repair. This activity is an extension of activity Housing Repair, which was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver, for financial purposes only.

Activity #4: Replacement of Multi-Family Housing. The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. SHA has its development sites and plans are prepared. However, they continue to negotiate with their insurance company and are anticipating a settlement soon. Additionally, the FEMA appeal process continues to be ongoing. Hill Homes is continuing to work with its board and residents on a development plan.

Activity #4(E): Replacement of Multi-Family Housing. This activity is an extension of activity Replacement of Multi-Family Housing, which was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver, for financial purposes only. Activity #5: Workforce Training. Training Resources of America completed its final training session. STCC trained a total of 30 students and TRA trained a total of 20 students. All funds have now been expended in this activity and the City anticipates closing it out next quarter.

Activity #6: Business Recovery Loan Program. The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. The first business loan of \$100,000 was approved this quarter to Youth on the Move, a transportation business for students and low-income residents on MassHealth and Medicaid, and an invoice is expected in the next quarter. Additionally, the sub-recipient has been reaching out to newly qualified businesses that are now eligible to the program under this amendment and the City anticipates additional loans moving forward in the next quarter.

Activity #6(E): Business Recovery Loan Program. This activity is an extension of activity Business Recovery Loan Program, which was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver, for final purposes only.

Activity #7: Urban Renewal. The amendment for a new activity for redevelopment and improvements along Marble Street and Central Street was approved this quarter. The City has been working on appraisals and environmental due diligence for all redevelopment projects. The City anticipates all future work to be submitted under the new created activity for these projects.

Activity #8: Roadways and Sidewalks. Central Street - The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. The design consultant has started the engineering design for the replacement of water mains within project limits andis working in coordination with the Springfield Water and Sewer Commission regarding locations of the proposed water mains and the replacement of all service connections. Currently the design consultant has delivered a 50% plan submission to the SWSC for review. The City anticipates a public meeting with impacted neighborhoods to take place next quarter. The design consultant has completed 80% of its required tasks to date. Marble Street - The design consultant has completed 91.8% of its required tasks to date and the City continues to work with the consultant towards the completion of the design for the extension of Marble Street. Six Corners - The City through its Department of Public Works and Economic Development team have secured \$2.77 million in funding for the construction of the Six Corners Intersection Improvements project through the Massworks Infrastrucutre Grant Program. The City had a pre-contract meeting with Massworks representatives to discuss the details related to the Massworks Infrastructure Grant Program. The design consultant has submitted a proposed contract ammendment necessary for continuation of the engineering design process, which is currently under review by the City. A public meeting has already taken place in partnership with the Park Commission and the City anticipates a second one taking place next quarter. The design consultant has completed 56.3% of its required tasks to date.

Activity #8(E): Roadways and Sidewalks. This activity is an extension of activity Roadways and Sidewalks, which was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver, for financial purposes only.

Activity #9: Parks. All park construction has been completed and all funds have been expended. This project will be closed next quarter.



Activity #10: Schools. The City of Springfield has completed the acquisitions of the South End Middle School and the Parent and Community Engagement Center. This activity is now closed.

Activity #11: City of Springfield - Administration. The City applied for and was granted an expenditure extension deadline waiver for this activity. The Contract Reporting Template has been uploaded to the Administrations activity page.
